In Luther's Small Catechism, there is a part for daily prayers. The first segment of those prayers has the famous Morning Prayer, but after it we find an italicized sentence. The sentence reads, "Then go joyfully to your work, singing a hymn, like that of the Ten Commandments, or whatever your devotion may suggest." It speaks volumes that we first acknowledge God in saying the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, Luther's Morning Prayer, and then look at our response after seeing who God is and what He has done. In the Gospel reading this week, we see love for God flow from who He is and what He has done. May we rejoice in doing the works He has given us to do throughout our lives!
